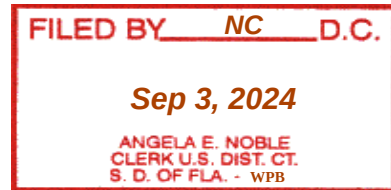

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2024-66

IN RE: COURT CLOSURES ON
NOVEMBER 29, 2024, AND
DECEMBER 24, 2024



The Administrative Office of the U. S. Courts has indicated that a chief judge as agency head may designate an additional day as a holiday, that is, as an excused absence. Examples include a day specially designated as a holiday by the President or the Congress of the United States or by local court order, or the day immediately before or after Christmas or Thanksgiving. Excused absence for a holiday is granted only for a specific date. Upon due consideration, and mindful of the dedication of staff servicing the Court and the public, it is

ORDERED that Friday, November 29, 2024, and Tuesday, December 24, 2024, are designated holidays. The Court will be closed. The Duty District Judge and Duty Magistrate Judge will be responsible for carrying out those Judges' duties, and the rules regarding judicial emergencies will continue to apply.
