ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 94-57

IN RE: PROPOSED CHANGES TO LOCAL RULES

---

Pursuant to the decision of the Judges at the meeting following the en banc hearing on November 2, 1994, the following action was taken. Local Rule 4(a)(2) will remain in full force and effect. In order to increase the effectiveness of the automatic stay provisions, the Clerk/Court Administrator is directed to:

- (1) obtain the tape recording or cassette immediately after a bond hearing where an intention to appeal is announced by the United States Attorney's Office;
- (2) deliver the cassettes or tapes promptly to the appropriate court reporter so that an expedited transcript can be delivered to the District Judge within forty-eight (48) hours of the bond hearing; the United States Attorney's Office is to pay the court reporter's charges; and
- (3) the Chief Pretrial Services Officer is to make a detailed study of "bond-jumping" incidents in this district over the last five years and to report such findings to the District Judges within six (6) months from date.

Other action taken by the Court following the en banc hearing is the adoption of proposed Rule 88.10(N) regarding the mutual exchange of discovery with respect to §§ 702, 703, and 705 of the Federal Rules of Evidence. This was adopted by the Court as presented to the en banc court.

The proposed Rule 88.10(Q) (1) providing that the United States Attorney's Office turn over discovery at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to pre-trial criminal hearings was granted by the Court with the exception of bond hearings; however, the United States Attorney's Office is to turn over the discovery no later than the beginning of the bond hearing.
