

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2009-50

**IN RE: MODIFICATION OF MIAMI MAGISTRATE  
JUDGE PAIRING ASSIGNMENT PLAN**

Administrative Order 2007-68 modified this Court's Magistrate Judge Pairing Assignment Plan in Miami until March 31, 2011. In that order, Magistrate Judge Barry Garber was paired with District Judges Lenard, Hoeverler, Highsmith, and Middlebrooks (Miami criminal cases only). Administrative Order 2009-5 modified that order by assigning all of Judge Lenard's even-numbered civil cases to Magistrate Judge William C. Turnoff. In view of Magistrate Judge Garber's change in status on October 31, 2009, it is

ORDERED that commencing November 1, 2009 until the end of the pairing period (March 31, 2011), Magistrate Judge Turnoff shall be paired with District Judges Lenard, Hoeverler, and Middlebrooks (Miami criminal cases only). Magistrate Judge Garber shall continue to work, as a "recalled" (i.e. senior) Magistrate Judge on all previously referred cases and participate in the duty roster. It is further

ORDERED that the Court modifies Administrative Order 2007-68 to require that as of November 1, 2009 all recusals from Magistrate Judges shall be randomly assigned. Paragraph III of that order assigning all recusals to Magistrate Judge Turnoff is deleted. Judge Turnoff shall continue to report to the undersigned on the land condemnation cases.

Administrative Order 2007-68 shall remain in full force and effect, except as modified by this Order.
